Introduction to "Growing up...Growing wise"

Growing up can be a challenging time for young people. "Growing up...Growing wise" is a resource designed to teach pupils about the nature and purpose of the changes of puberty, to help them deal with these changes in a practical way and to encourage them to make wise decisions as they develop and mature. The lessons discuss relationships and marriage and teach about conception and birth in an age-appropriate way.

The resource includes:

- slides with information, diagrams, pictures & video clips
- detailed teacher's guide with lesson plans
- differentiated worksheets
- parents' evening slide show and sample letter

"Growing up...Growing wise" is designed to be given by a teacher to pupils in school years 5 or 6 and is divided into three lessons. The video clips feature interviews with a couple, Tim and Bec, and follow their relationship from when they meet and decide to go out with each other up to the time when they are married with children.

The presentation is written from a Christian perspective with input from parents, teachers and health professionals.

What "Growing up...Growing wise" teaches

Lesson I: How your body changes

This lesson explains the nature and purposes of puberty and how the changes of puberty are controlled by hormones. The physical changes of puberty in boys and girls are discussed in detail with an explanation of the biology as well as clear and sensitive practical teaching on how boys and girls can deal with these changes.

Worksheets: Reproductive organs, Changes during puberty

Note: If it is possible, we recommend giving this lesson in single sex groups. Separate presentations for a girls only group and a boys only group can be found on the CD. These presentations omit some of the more sensitive details about the changes in the opposite sex. The slides omitted in each presentation are clearly marked in the presentation overview and in the lesson script.

Lesson 2: Growing up

This lesson explains how young people will grow in maturity. It looks at five ways in which children should be wise with the increasing freedom that they will gain during puberty. The lesson encourages young people to be sensible with money , choose good friends, use their phone and the internet carefully, avoid harmful substances and to honour their parents.

This lesson explains the new desires and feelings of attraction that develop during puberty. It discusses going out and teaches about the promises of marriage and what they mean. The lesson includes videos of Tim and Bec talking about their experience of going out and marriage, and a video of a couple making their marriage vows.

Worksheets: Being wise, Marriage

Lesson 3: Babies and family life

This lesson covers how a baby develops and looks at some of the responsibilities involved in family life. Romantic love is explained and the lesson shows how the committed love of marriage offers a secure relationship for having and bringing up children. Sexual intercourse and the development of a baby from fertilisation to birth are explained. The importance of helpfulness, faithfulness and forgiveness are discussed as qualities to help make a family strong.

Worksheets: Babies, Family life

Using "Growing up...Growing wise"

This booklet contains detailed notes for each lesson which provide the teacher with all the necessary facts to support the presentation. It is not intended that the notes should be read out verbatim, but be used to help the teacher in preparation before giving the lessons. Lesson plans and an overview of the slides used in each lesson are also provided. A PDF version of this booklet is available on the accompanying CD.

Differentiated worksheets designed to reinforce aspects of each lesson can be photocopied from the back of this booklet or printed directly from the CD.

Working with parents

It is good practice to work in partnership with parents when delivering this sensitive material and to encourage parents to talk to their own children about puberty and relationships. Parents should be informed when the teaching is scheduled to take place and invited to a meeting to preview and discuss the material that will be used.

A sample letter, which can be edited to suit your circumstances and briefly outlines what will be taught, can be found on the disc.

A presentation that could be used to inform parents of what their children will be taught is also included on the disc. The presentation explains the ethos and aims behind "Growing up... Growing wise" and gives an overview of the material that will be covered in class. It may also be helpful to have a copy of this booklet available for parents to look through.

LESSON PLAN Lesson I: How your body changes

Learning Objectives - Understand what puberty is and why it happens - Introduce pupils to male and female reproductive organs - Learn about the changes of puberty and how to deal with them	
Resources	- Lesson 1 PowerPoint presentation (from 'Growing up Growing wise' disc) - Worksheets (photocopied from the back of this booklet or printed from the disc)

Introduction:

- Introduce the idea of growing up (slides 1-13)
 - Discuss how pupils lives will be different in 15 years' time using questions on the slides and introductory video
 - Introduce puberty

Main: (this could be done in single sex groups)

Hormones (slides 14-19)

- Explain what hormones are and how they work

Changes in boys and girls (slides 20-36)

- Discuss with the class 'how do people four years older look different from you?'
- Teach about the changes that will affect boys and girls during puberty (growing taller, growing more hair, sweating more, getting spots) and give practical advice on how to deal with them

Changes in boys during puberty (slides 37-55)

- Show diagram of male reproductive organs and point out the different parts
- Teach about the changes that will affect boys during puberty (testicles and penis grow, testicles start to produce sperm, voice changes, start to have erections and wet dreams) and give practical advice on how to deal with them

Changes in girls during puberty (slides 56-88)

- Show diagram of female reproductive organs and point out the different parts
- Teach about the changes that will affect girls during puberty (breasts develop, periods start) and give practical advice on how to deal with them
- Explain the menstrual cycle to help pupils understand why periods occur



Vocabulary	Puberty — A time of rapid change in which a child moves through the teenage years to adulthood Hormones — Chemical messengers that tell different parts of the body how to change and work Testosterone — The hormone that causes most of the changes in a boy's body during puberty Progesterone — One of the hormones that causes changes in a girl's body during puberty Oestrogen — One of the hormones that causes changes in a girl's body during puberty Testicles — The place where sperm and testosterone are produced Scrotum — The skin covering the testicles Penis — A tube through which urine and sperm pass Bladder — The place where urine collects Ovary — The place where female eggs are stored Fallopian tube — The tube which connects the ovary and the uterus Uterus — (womb) The place where a baby grows Cervix — The entrance to the uterus Vagina — (birth passage) Where the reproductive system opens onto the outside of the body Menstrual cycle — A monthly pattern of changes in a girl's reproductive organs Period — A time of bleeding from the vagina which occurs every month





































































































Female reproductive organs









An introduction to puberty



In 15 years, how old will you be?

Ask the class the question on the slide.

The following slides will encourage pupils to think about the future and to recognise that there will be significant changes in their lives during the next 15 years.



What will you be doing?

Ask the class to think about what job they might like to be doing in 15 years time.

Some ideas are given in the pictures on the slide.



Where will you be living?

Ask the class to think about where they would like to be living in 15 years time.

For example, they may still be living at home with their family, sharing a flat with friends, have their own house or be living with their husband or wife.

Video: Meet Tim & Bec

Video: Meet Tim and Bec

In this video we meet Tim and Bec and their children, Ciara, Izzy and Jonah.

Throughout the lessons pupils will learn more about marriage and family life through interviews with Tim and Bec.





What jobs might Tim and Bec do in their family?

Discuss the question on the slide with the class. Try to help them think of all the different jobs mothers and fathers have to do to run a home and look after each other and their children.

The pictures on the slide show some examples – cooking meals, taking children to school, washing up, paying bills.



Could you take on these responsibilities now?

Help the pupils realise that, although they could do some of the individual jobs, they are not yet mature enough to take on the full responsibility of running a home and having a family.



What is puberty?

Ask the pupils if they have heard of puberty and what they think it is.
