About this presentation

Introduction

Though pornography has always been around, never before has there been so much or such extreme pornography easily available to young people as in today's culture. Material that was once hard to come by is now just a click away due to the vast quantity of pornographic material on the internet and the prevalence of computers, tablets and mobile phones among young people. As they grow up, it is natural for young people to be interested and inquisitive about sex; for some young people pornography offers them an easy way to explore this curiosity. Some turn to pornography as a way of dealing with pain and hurt. Others may be exposed to pornography whilst using the internet for other things or may be shown it by friends. Whatever the reason, pornography can lead to many negative consequences in a young person's life.

There is very little to protect young people from these videos and images, the memories of which will be lasting and can be extremely harmful. Many people think that it is possible to separate the fantasy they see in pornography from real life relationships; however, both research and personal stories indicate that watching pornography affects our thinking and expectations. A recent report stated that ChildLine have found that "there has been a 70 per cent increase in the past 12 months in boys calling specifically to talk about pornography – about how guilty and confused it's making them fee!"¹.

This presentation has been written to warn young people about the dangers of pornography and to help them to make good and informed decisions about what they view. The material has been prepared for schools by the Christian charity Lovewise.

Presentation summary



I) What is pornography?

The presentation begins by explaining that pornography refers to material that is sexually explicit and intended to cause sexual arousal.



2) What is wrong with pornography?

This section explains that pornography separates sexual acts from a relationship. Possible consequences of this are explained under four headings:

- Pornography spoils future relationships Looking at pornography makes it hard to form a good relationship and can ruin future relationships including marriage.
- Pornography makes you think of people as objects
 Looking at pornography can affect the way we treat people and can give us unrealistic expectations of how people should act and what they should look like.
- Pornography can damage your mental health Looking at pornography can be addictive and make some people self-absorbed and reclusive. Viewing pornography has been associated with many sexual crimes.
- Pornography causes people to be abused
 Many in this industry are exploited and abused, and its production is closely linked to prostitution and trafficking.



3) Pornography and the law

In this section we teach about the law on pornography and discuss issues surrounding sexting.



4) A better alternative


Young people are encouraged to value loving and committed relationships rather than just sexual arousal, and to treat others with care and respect. The presentation teaches that sexual intimacy is a good gift designed for marriage.



5) Making good decisions

We end by giving practical suggestions about how to avoid pornography and to seek help if already involved. We explain that God offers forgiveness and a new start to those who have made mistakes.

What is pornography?



Greek:

porni = a prostitute graphein = to write

The word pornography comes from two Greek words, 'porni' which means a prostitute and 'graphein' which means to write/record.



Pornography is...

- sexually explicit
- made to cause sexual arousal

(Includes books, pictures, magazines, films, video games and animation)

Pornography refers to material that is sexually explicit and intended to cause sexual arousal. Probably the most prevalent and easy-to-access forms of pornography today are pictures and films on the internet. But pornography can also include a variety of different media such as books, magazines, sculpture, drawing, animation, film, and video games.



The internet and pornography

Though pornography has always been around, never before has there been so much or such extreme pornography easily available to young people as in today's culture.

easy to access

Material that was once hard to come by is now just a click away due to the vast quantity of pornographic material on the internet and the prevalence of computers, tablets and mobile phones among young people. Pornography is easy to find on the internet and some may be exposed to pornographic material through unwanted adverts or whilst using the internet for other purposes.

- easy to do in secret

As many young people have their own phones, tablets and computers, it is hard to monitor what they are exposed to. As they are growing up, it is natural for young people to be interested and inquisitive about sex; for some young people pornography offers them an easy way to exercise this curiosity without anyone knowing.

- more pornography is being made

The internet has increased the demand for pornographic material; as a result more and more pornography is being made.
